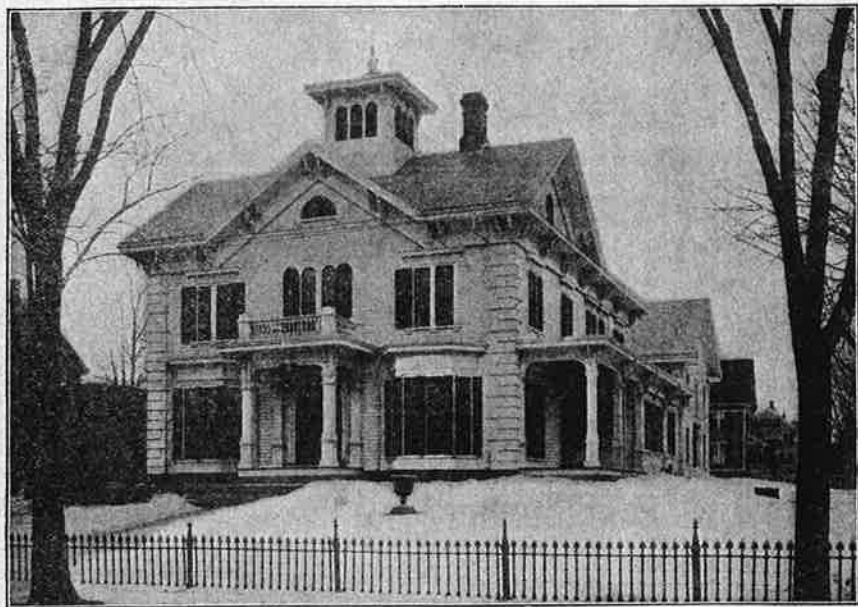

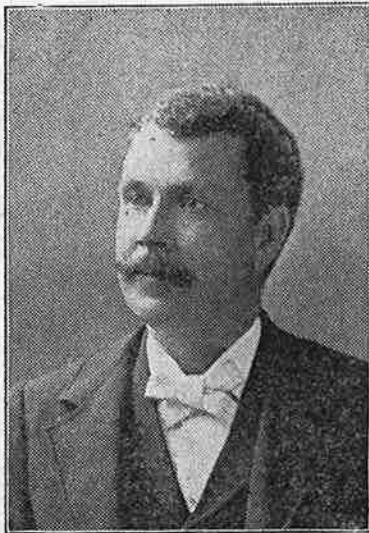
And they did so mightily amuse the Chief and his warriors that the pipe of peace was smoked with great solemnity, and they lived happily ever afterwards.

## Historical Sketch of the Town of Stoughton.



HARMINGLY situated on the top of the ridge forming the water shed from which the Neponset River to the North, and the Taunton River to the South, take their course to the sea, Stoughton possesses all the health-giving properties of climate incident to an elevated site. It shares with the adjoining town of Sharon the same ozone for which the latter town is so justly famed; thus offering to the tired and invalid person seeking health and rest, those things of which they stand most in need.

¶ To the active business man, Stoughton holds out every inducement. A trip of thirty minutes by rail brings the busy worker to his desk or work in the city, as early as his hours of business may require his presence. The short run from this suburban town, with trains at frequent intervals, is less tedious and more certain than the annoyingly delayed trolley of the crowded streets of the city.

¶ Originally Sharon, Canton, a small part of Dedham, and nearly all of Foxborough, as well as Stoughton, were taken from Dorchester. The Town of Stoughton was incorporated December 22nd; 1726, and took its name from Governor William Stoughton. The articles of incorporation required the Town to procure within twelve months a learned minister of good conversation, and likewise to provide a schoolmaster to instruct the youth in reading and writing. That these duties were abundantly attended to, the town to-day bears ample evidence, in that they have accomplished their full share in making Stoughton one of the most desirable residential towns in the state.

¶ In defense of the Government in foreign and civil wars, Stoughton bears a record of which she has just cause to be proud. Full many a grave, to-day decorated by little Union flags, are eloquent tributes to the valour and loyalty of her sons.

¶ This little sketch, compiled for the Chicataubut Club, would not be complete without some reference to that famous Indian warrior, from whom the Club has taken its name. Mr. Huntoon, in his history of Canton, says:

¶ "In 1620, when the forefathers landed at Plymouth, they found the Indian Chief Chicataubut in full possession of all the country. It is not accurately known how far his jurisdiction extended. His tribe, the Massachusetts, were the next great people north of the Wampanoags, and were settled principally around Massachusetts Bay. The petty tribes around paid tribute to him.

¶ "In 1621 he went to Plymouth and made a treaty with the English. He consented to the occupancy of Dorchester by the English in 1630, and was paid to his satisfaction.

¶ "He died of smallpox in 1633, and Kitchamakin, his brother, was appointed to govern as sachem during the minority of Wampatuck, son of Chicataubut."

¶ It is a well authenticated tradition that not many years before the settlement of this section by the English, a disease or plague, devastated the country. This, with the murderous inter-tribal wars greatly depleted the Indian population, leaving only remnants of various tribes scattered throughout the country. In the vicinity of Great Blue Hill, York and Ponkapoag Ponds, the Indians of this section made their last residence, and to-day but a memory remains of those over whom Sachem Chicataubut ruled.

¶ As the last expiring embers of the campfires vanished from the tepees of the Red Men near Great Blue Hill, another light, illumined by the Fathers of the Revolution was kindling; and from the old Doty Tavern there sounded the rallying cry pregnant with liberty and freedom, which culminated in that grand inheritance our forefathers have given us and which we to-day enjoy.
